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Welcome to the world of Franklin! With the Professeur d'anglais you can find over 2,000,000 translations, correct misspellings, conjugate words, study the Grammar

Guide, save words to My Word List, sharpen your spelling and increase your French vocabulary with six Learning Exercises, and play seven fun, educational word games.

Color Keys

conj (Red) Conjugates a word.

(Green) Toggles the entry language between French and English.

dict (Yellow) Goes to the dictionary.

Function Keys

Turns the product on or off.

In the dictionary, goes to the Word Entry screen.

Backs up, erases a letter, or turns off the highlight at an entry.

Enters a word, selects an item, or begins a highlight in an entry.

Displays the main menus for the dictionary.

At the Word Entry screen, types a ? to stand for a letter in a word. At a menu, displays a menu item. At a dictionary entry, displays the headword. In games, reveals the word and forfeits the game.

Shifts to type capital letters and punctuation marks.

Shifts to allow **préc**, **suiv**, **ht**, **bas** and to type a hyphen (-) or cedilla (**ç**). In some units, **f**_n is replaced by (\$\frac{1}{12}\$).

Carte Exits the book you were reading.

Direction Keys

Move in the indicated direction.

At menus and dictionary entries, pages down. At the Word Entry screen, types a space.

This card will only work in BOOKMAN II platforms, including the DBD-460, BDS-590, BIL-1640 and BAS-1590/1595 models.

The red, green, yellow, and blue keys on your BOOKMAN change functions according to which book is selected. When the built-in book is selected, the colour kevs function as labelled on the BOOKMAN keyboard. When a book card is selected, the colour keys function

as labelled on that book card.

When the language or languages in your book card are different from those in your built-in book, the key references may also be different. Please refer to the grid below for help in determining a particular key's function.

Installing Book Cards

- 1. Turn your product off.
- 2. Turn your product over.
- 3. Align the tabs on the book card with the notches in the slot.



- 4. Press the book card down until it snaps into place.
- > Removing Book Cards

Warning: Never install or remove a book card while your product is on. Any information that was entered in the built-in book or book card will be erased.

➤ Book Card Troubleshooting

If your book card is performing erratically, follow the reset instructions for your platform. If this does not fix the problem, remove the book card and then remove the white rubber strip located between the two metal pins. Clean the rubber strip with your fingers and then replace it making sure it is completely in its notch.

Selecting a Book

Once a book card is installed in the product, you can select which book you want to use.

- 1. Turn your product on.
- 2. Press carte

3. Press ⊕ or ⊕ to highlight your selection.

- 4. Press (entrer) to select it.
- ➤ About Screen Illustrations

Some screen illustrations in this User's Guide may differ slightly from what you see on screen. This does not mean that your product is malfunctioning. The examples in the English half of this manual use English as the message language.

Changing the Language

Message Language

When you turn on this product for the first time, you must choose the message language. Press \boldsymbol{a} for French or press \boldsymbol{b} for English.



The message language is the language of prompts, help, and other messages. You can change the message language after your initial decision. See "Changing the Settings" on page 32 to learn how.

Entry Language

The entry language is the language in which you enter words at the Word Entry screen. This determines which dictionary you will use, French or English.

- 1. Press (menu).
- 2. Use the direction keys to highlight

 $\begin{bmatrix} F_{ENG.}^{FR} \end{bmatrix}$, and then press <u>entrer</u> to access the French-to-English dictionary.

Select $\left[\begin{smallmatrix} E & G \\ FRA \end{smallmatrix}\right]$ at the icon menu to go to the English-to-French dictionary.

Or you can press (lang) at the Word Entry screen to switch between French and English.

Using the Main Menu

When you press (menu), you will see ten icons. Use these to quickly take you to different parts of your Professeur d'anglais.



Viewing a Demonstration or Tutorial

You can view a demonstration or tutorial of this dictionary at any time.

- 1. Press menu.
- 2. Use the arrow keys to highlight and press (entrer).



3. Press (to highlight either *Tuto-rial* or *View Demo* and press (entrer).

To stop the demonstration or exit from the Tutorial and go to the Word Entry screen, press (effac).

To go to the main menu, press (menu).

When a book card is installed in your product, select *View Demo* from the Setup menu to see the demonstration for that card.

➤ Follow the Arrows

The flashing arrows on the right of the screen show which arrow keys you can press to move around menus or view more text.

Changing the Settings

When using this dictionary, you can activate the *Leam a Word* feature, or adjust the screen contrast, the shutoff time, the type size, and the message language. The shutoff time is how long your product stays on if you forget to turn it off.

- 1. Press menu in the dictionary.
- 2. Use the arrow keys to highlight and press entrer.
- 3. Settings will be highlighted. Press (entrer) to select it.



- Press () or () to move ► to Learn a Word, Contrast, Shutoff, Type Size, or Messages.
- 5. Press ← or → to change the setting.

Your changes are automatically saved.

6. Press entrer when done.

Press **effac** to return to the Word Entry screen.

Changing the Settings

➤ Learn a New Word

Your dictionary comes with a Learn a Word feature to help you increase your French or English vocabulary. Each time you turn your Professeur d'anglais on, you can see a different headword taken from the dictionary. If you wish to turn this feature on, press

When French is the entry language, you will be shown a French word and when English is the entry language, you will be shown an English word. To learn how to change the entry language, read Changing the Language on page 31.

➤ Help is Always at Hand

You can view a help message at any screen by pressing (aide). Press (espace) or (1) to read. To exit help, press (effac).

Translating French Words

Your Professeur d'anglais is fully bilingual. Try translating a French word.

- 1. Press (lang) to change the entry language from English to French, if needed.
- 2. Type a word (e.g., étude).

To erase a letter, press are. Note: you do not need to type accents. To type accents, if desired, type the letter (e.g., a) and press f repeatedly until the accent you want appears (e.g., a). If you want to type a ç, then hold and press c. To type a capital, hold and press a letter key. To type a number, hold and press a-p. To type a hyphen, hold and press j.

Translating French Words

Understanding Definitions

Dictionary entries consist of headwords, parts of speech, and/or definitions. Other forms of the word may follow the headword. Capitalized words indicate the category for which the word is used. After the translation, you may see a list of usage examples.

- 1. Type savoir.
- 2. Press entrer.

> Explanation of Genders

French nouns are different than English nouns in that they must either be masculine or feminine. Each definition of a noun indicates which gender it is with *m* or *f*.

➤ Misspelling Words

If you enter a misspelled word, a list of corrections appears. Highlight the word you want and then press (entrer to see its dictionary entry.

Translating English Words

You can also use the Professeur d'anglais to translate English words into French.

- 1. Press (lang) to change the entry language from French to English, if needed.
- 2. Type a word (e.g., *how*).

To erase a letter, press arr. Note: you do not need to type accents. To type accents, if desired, type the letter (e.g., e) and press f) repeatedly until the accent you want appears (e.g., e). To type a capital, hold and press a letter key. To type a number, hold and press app. To type a hyphen, hold and press j.

3. Press *entrer* to view the French translation.



Translating English Words

➤ Choosing Multiple Forms

Some words in this dictionary have more than one form (e.g. resume, résumé). When the word you are looking up has multiple forms, the different forms appear in a list.

Simply highlight the form you want and press (entre) to see its dictionary entry. For example, enter *resume* at the Word Entry screen.






Highlight the form you want and press *entrer* to see its dictionary entry. To go back to the Multiple Forms list, press *arr*).

Finding Letters in Words

If you are uncertain about how to spell a word, type a question mark (?) in place of each unknown letter. To find prefixes, suffixes, and other parts of words, type an asterisk (*) in a word. Each asterisk stands for a series of letters. **Note:** If you type an asterisk at the beginning of a word, it may take a little while to find the matching words.

- Press (long) to switch to the French Word Entry screen, if needed.
- 2. Type a word with ?s and *s.



To type an asterisk, hold down **(maj)** and press **(?*)**.

Using the Learning Exercises, you can read cultural notes, test your spelling, improve your vocabulary, browse the TOEFL® Test Word List, and get grammar guidance (see "Using the Grammar Guide" on page 38).

Your Professeur d'anglais includes a helpful grammar guide that describes parts of speech. You can view it by selecting from the main menu or by pressing (legon).

From the Learning Exercises Menu

- 1. Press (menu).
- 2. Highlight and then press

- 3. Press (1) to highlight *Grammar Guide* and then press *entrer*).



- 4. Press () to highlight the topic you want to study and then press (entrer).
- 5. Press _{espace} or ↓ to read.

From an Inflection Screen

- 1. Press (menu), highlight (given) or (control).
 - 2. Type a word to conjugate, and then press (conj).
 - Press m + → or ← repeatedly to find the tense you want to read about in the Grammar Guide.

Press to view this help message. The *passé simple* (past definite or past historic) is used to record a completed action in the past.

Information about the tense will be displayed along with usage examples.

5. Press <u>arr</u> to return to the inflection screen or press <u>offac</u> to return to the Word Entry screen.

Advanced Verb Conjugations

Conjugations show inflections, or changes in a word's gender, tense, etc. This dictionary includes extensive inflections of nouns, verbs and adjectives.

From the Icon Menu

1. For example, press menu, use the arrow keys to highlight (French Conjugation), and then press entre).

To choose English conjugation, press You can also press Conj and then Lang to choose the language.

- 2. Type a word (e.g., lire).
- 3. Press (conj).

If needed, highlight the part of speech or translation you want and press (entrer).

From a Dictionary Entry

Some words have different parts of speech or multiple translations. You can easily find which part of speech or specific translation you will need to conjugate by first looking up the word and then pressing conj. Follow this example.

1. Press menu, use the arrow keys to highlight [FR] and then press (entrer).

To choose English, press [ENG]. You can also press (con) and then (lang) to choose the language.

- 2. Type a word (e.g., écrire).
- 3. Press (entrer) to look it up.

➤ Accenting Letters

You can look up accented words without typing accents. If there are no Multiple Forms, the Professeur d'anglais will take you directly to the word. If there are Multiple Forms, you will have to choose the correct word from a Multiple Forms list. See "Choosing Multiple Forms" on page 35 for more information.

Remember, if you want to enter an accent yourself, type the letter and press (1) until the appropriate accent appears. You can also hold $(\overline{f_n})$ and press c to type a c.

➤ Getting Grammar Guidance

When viewing inflections, you can press aide to go directly to the Grammar Guide and view detailed descriptions of how to use the inflections you were viewing along with usage examples.

Press 🔵 to view this help message. NOUNS Every noun in French is either masculine or feminine in gender.

➤ Viewing English Inflections

If you are unfamiliar with inflections, it may be helpful to look at some inflected forms of English verbs. Switch the entry language back to English, type write, and press (on) to see the different forms of the English verb "to write".

> Verb Conjugations

The Professeur d'anglais conjugates French verbs into the following forms: present indicative, indicative imperfect, indicative simple past, simple future indicative, present conditional, present subjunctive, imperfect subjunctive, indicative passé composé, pluperfect indicative, indicative past anterior, indicative future anterior, conditional perfect, perfect subjunctive, pluperfect subjunctive, imperative, present participle, and past participle.

Translating Traveller's Phrases

There are two ways in which you can translate several helpful phrases in categories ranging from *Emergencies* to *Business Communication* to *Time & Dates*. Note that the English phrase always appears before the French phrase.

Browsing Through Phrases

- 1. Press (menu).
- 2. Use the arrow keys to highlight and then press entrer to view the English phrases.

Press to view the French phrases.



You can also hold (n) and press (r) to go straight to the Phrases menu in the same language as the lookup language.





Using My Word List

You can save up to 40 words total, in both English and French, in My Word List for personal study or review. My Word List is saved between sessions unless your product is reset.



- 5. Press (entrer) to delete that word.

Erasing My Word List

1. Press (menu).

Or you can press (leçon) and then press (entrer).

- 2. Highlight and then press entrer.
- 3. Press <u>lang</u> to switch to the English or French List, if needed.
- 4. Select Erase the List.

Press **y** to erase the list or press **n** to cancel. Note: When you erase one list, the other list is not erased.



Changing Game Settings

Before you play, you can choose the source of the words, the skill level, the language, and whether or not graphics will be used.

- 1. Press menu, highlight and press entrer.
- 2. Hold down (maj) and press (j) to highlight Game Settings and press (entrer).



3. Use ∱ or ↓ to move ► to Words or Skill.

Words chooses the source of the words: All of them, TOEFL® Test List, My Word List, or Enter your own.

Skill determines how easy or difficult a game is.

- 4. Use ⊙ or ⊙ to change the setting(s) you want.
- 5. Press (entrer) when done.

Selecting a Game

In the Games list, use () or () to move the highlight to the game of your choice and press (entrer).



Getting Help in the Games

During any game you can read instructions by pressing **aide**.

You can get a hint by holding (mg) and pressing (?*) or reveal the game word by pressing (?*).

Note: If you reveal the game word, you lose the round.

Hangman

Hangman selects a mystery word and challenges you to guess it letter by letter. The letters of the mystery word are hidden by question marks. The number of guesses remaining is indicated by #'s.

Type letters that you think are in the mystery word. If you are correct, the letter appears in place of the corresponding question mark(s). To see the translation of the game word, press (entrer). Press (arr) to return to the game.

Conjumania!™

Conjumania! teaches verb conjugations. It shows you an infinitive verb and asks you to enter a conjugation. Your conjugation must be spelled correctly, including accents. Type your guess and then press orretum. To see the Press orretum. To retum to the game. To try a new conjugation, press (space).

Gender Tutor™

Gender Tutor asks you to guess the gender of French nouns. Press m for masculine and f for feminine. To see the translation of the game word, press entrer. Press arr to return to the game.

Word Train™

In Word Train, you and the train take turns typing letters to form a word. Whoever types the last letter of the word wins. To view the letters you can type at your turn, hold and press Press To be and a round and reveal the word. To see the translation of the game word, press It oreturn to the game.

Guess the Word

In Guess the Word, you must type the missing letters in the mystery word. To read the definition of the mystery word, press Ω , if

needed. Press ⊕ or ⊕, if needed, to select a missing letter, and then type the letter that you think belongs there. Continue typing letters until the word is complete or no more tries are left. Or press? to give up and reveal the word. To see the translation of the game word, press entrey. Press arr to return to the game. Press ⊕ to play a new round.

Word Auction™

In Word Auction, you try to bid on all the letters of a mystery word, before your cash runs out. The amount of each bid depends on the frequency of the letter. All bids will cost you whether correct or incorrect. If you guess the word by revealing all of the letters, your remaining cash is added to the next round. To see the translation of the game word, press (entrer). Press (err) to return to the game.

Word Blaster™

In Word Blaster you try to guess the mystery word before all its letters appear. As soon as you know the word press (entrer). Then type your guess and press (entrer). Press (arr) to return to the game.

Transferring Words Between Books
