Key Guide

Color Keys

SUM (**red**) At a chapter, displays a chapter summary.

MARK (**green**) Places a bookmark at a paragraph in the novel.

DEF (**yellow**) Displays a definition of a marked word in the novel.

CHAR (**blue**) Displays a character's biography.

Function Keys

BACK Backs up to the previous screen.

CARD Exits the selected book.

CLEAR Highlights the Contents menu.

ENTER Selects a menu item, or highlights a word or a superscript *D* (*D*²) in the novel.

HELP Displays help messages.

MENU Toggles between the menus and text.

ON/OFF Turns BOOKMAN on or off.


P Displays the Progress Gauge.

?* At the text of the novel, displays the chapter and page number.

Automatic Scrolling Keys

S At the text of the novel, turns the automatic scrolling on or off.


SPACE or **Z** If the automatic scrolling is turned on, suspend or resume the scrolling. If the automatic scrolling is turned off, page down.


 Change the speed of the automatic scrolling.

Direction Keys

 Scroll line by line.

 Scroll screen by screen.

☆ +  At the text of the novel, go to the next or previous paragraph. At a study guide entry selected from the Study Guide menu, go to the next or previous entry.

CAP +  At the text of the novel, go to the next or previous chapter.

☆ + **CARD** Look up a highlighted word from this novel in another BOOKMAN book.

Installing a Book Card

Warning: Never install or remove a book card when your BOOKMAN is turned on. If you do, information that you've entered in its built-in book, as well as in any other installed book cards, will be erased.

1. Turn your BOOKMAN off.
2. Turn your BOOKMAN over.
3. Align the tabs of the book card with the notches in the slot.



4. Press the book card down until it snaps into place.

► Removing a Book Card

Warning: When you remove a book card to install another, information that you entered in the removed book card will be erased.

Selecting a Book

Once you've installed a book card in your BOOKMAN, you can select which book you want to use.

1. Turn your BOOKMAN on.
2. Press **CARD**.



These are sample books.

3. Press **⇨** or **⇩** to highlight a book symbol.



4. Press **ENTER** to select it.

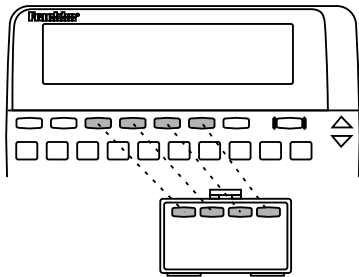
► Resuming Where You Left Off

You can turn off your BOOKMAN at any time. When you turn on your BOOKMAN again, the screen that you last viewed appears.

Using the Color Keys

The red, green, yellow, and blue keys on the top row of the BOOKMAN keyboard change their functions according to which book you've selected to use.

If you've selected the built-in book, the color keys function as labeled on the BOOKMAN keyboard. If you've selected a book card, the color keys function as labeled on that card.



Remember, when you've selected a book card, the color keys function as labeled on that card, not as on the keyboard.

Viewing a Demonstration

Before you begin, you may want to see a brief demonstration of how to use this book. Simply install the book card and then follow these steps.

1. Press **CLEAR**.
2. Use the arrow keys to highlight the Setup menu.
3. Press **↓** to highlight **View Demo**.



4. Press **ENTER**.
5. To stop the demonstration, press **CLEAR**.

► Help is Always at Hand

You can see a help message at virtually any screen by pressing **HELP**. Press **↓** or **↑** to read the message. Press **BACK** to exit it.

To read a tutorial about how to use this book, select *Tutorial* from the Setup menu.

Changing the Settings

You can adjust the automatic scrolling speed, type size, shutoff time, and screen contrast of this book. The shutoff time is how long your BOOKMAN stays on if you forget to turn it off.

1. Press **CLEAR**.
2. Use the arrow keys to highlight **Set Scroll Speed, Set Type Size, Set Shutoff, or Set Contrast on the Setup menu.**



The slanted arrow indicates a submenu.

3. Press **ENTER**.
4. Press **↑** or **↓** to change the setting.

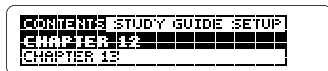
Or, if you selected *Set Scroll Speed*, press **⇒** or **⇐**.

5. Press **ENTER** when done.
Or press **BACK** to leave the setting unchanged.

Selecting a Chapter

To read this novel, you must first select a chapter. Here is how.

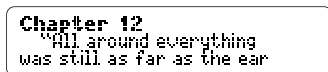
1. Press **CLEAR**.
The Contents menu is highlighted.
2. Type a chapter number (e.g. 12).



To type a number, hold **☆** and press the numbered keys. To undo a number, press **BACK**.

You can also highlight a chapter by pressing **↓** or **DN**.

3. When the chapter is highlighted, press **ENTER**.



This is the start of the Chapter 12. To learn how to read it, see "Reading the Novel."

4. Press **BACK** or **MENU** to go back to the menus.

Reading the Novel

Once you've selected a chapter to read, you can scroll through its pages manually or automatically. You can even adjust the speed of the automatic scrolling as you read.

1. Select a chapter (e.g. *Chapter 12*).

2. To scroll manually, use these keys:

To...	Use...
scroll line by line	↓ or ↑
scroll screen by screen	⏴ or ⏵
go to the next or previous paragraph	☆ + ⏴ or ⏵
go to the next or previous chapter	Ⓢ + ↓ or ↑

3. Press Ⓢ to scroll automatically.

4. To change the speed of the automatic scrolling, press ⏴ or ⏵ repeatedly.



5. To suspend and resume the auto-

Reading the Novel

matic scrolling, use Ⓢ or Ⓩ.
6. Press Ⓢ to turn off the automatic scrolling.

► About Automatic Scrolling

Whenever you're reading the novel, you can turn on the automatic scrolling by pressing Ⓢ. To turn it off, press Ⓢ again.

Pressing Ⓢ or Ⓩ is not the same as pressing Ⓢ. After pressing Ⓢ, pressing Ⓢ or Ⓩ suspends or resumes the automatic scrolling.

However, if you haven't pressed Ⓢ to start the automatic scrolling, pressing Ⓢ or Ⓩ scrolls down screen by screen.


You don't have to suspend the automatic scrolling to change its speed. Simply press ⏴ or ⏵.

Also, during automatic scrolling, the automatic shutoff is disabled and there is a brief pause at the end of each paragraph.

Reading the Novel

► Viewing the Page Number

You can see the number of the chapter and page that you're reading by pressing **[?]**.

► Viewing Your Progress

While reading the novel, you can quickly gauge your progress by pressing **[P]**.

You can also see the Progress Gauge by selecting *View Progress* from the Setup menu.

Using the Study Guides

As you read this novel, you can use the study guides: definitions of marked words, biographies of certain characters, and summaries of chapters.

You can read a chapter summary whenever you're reading the novel. You can read a character biography whenever a character's name appears in the novel. (Not all characters have biographies.) And you can read a definition whenever a word marked by a superscript *D* (i.e., ^D) appears.

Try this example.

1. From the Contents menu, select Chapter 26.

Using the Study Guides

The definition scrolls automatically and then disappears. You don't need to press **(BACK)** to go back to the novel.

► Using the Study Guide Menu

The definitions, characters' biographies, and chapter summaries are also listed on the Study Guide menu.

To use the Study Guide menu, press **↓** to highlight *Definitions*, *Characters*, or *Chapter Summaries* and then press **(ENTER)**. Next, highlight a study guide entry by typing its first few letters (e.g., *DO* for *Doramin* under *Characters*). Then press **(ENTER)** to select it.

Once you've selected a study guide entry, you can view the next or previous entry listed on the menu by holding **(☆)** and pressing **DN** or **UP**.

Using the Study Guides

► Viewing Multiple Biographies

Sometimes more than one character's name appears on screen. When this happens, pressing **CHAR** (the blue key) displays the biography of the topmost character.

To view the second, third, or subsequent biography, follow these steps. First, press **ENTER** to start the highlight.

Finally, press **ENTER** to see the biography. To go back to the novel, press **BACK**.

Using the Study Guides

► Viewing Multiple Definitions

When more than one word marked with a superscript *D* appears on the screen, you can see the second, third, and subsequent definitions by pressing **DEF** (the yellow key) two, three, or more times in succession.

As you do, notice that the superscript *D* of each defined word is highlighted and then its definition appears.

You can also see definitions by pressing **ENTER** at the text of the novel and using the arrow keys to highlight a superscript *D* after a word. Then press **ENTER** to see its definition.

Using Bookmarks

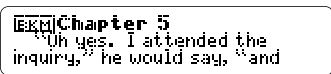
► Placing a Bookmark

You can place up to four bookmarks in this novel. You can place only one bookmark at a paragraph.

1. At the text of the novel, press **MARK** (the green key).



2. Press **ENTER** to add a bookmark at the current paragraph.



You may need to scroll up to see the bookmark (BKM).

► Finding a Bookmark

Once you've placed a bookmark, you can easily find it.

1. Press **MARK** (the green key).
2. Press **↓** to highlight a chapter.

Using Bookmarks

Your bookmarks are listed by chapter.

3. Press **ENTER** to go to the bookmark.

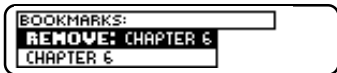
► Removing a Bookmark

Warning: When you remove this book card from your BOOKMAN, or when you reset your BOOKMAN, all your bookmarks will be erased.

1. Finding any bookmark.

To learn how, read "Finding a Bookmark."

2. When a bookmark (BKM) is on screen, press **MARK** (the green key).



3. Press **ENTER** to remove the bookmark.

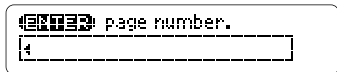
Returning to a Page

Particularly if you don't read the novel in one sitting, you may want to return to specific page (i.e., paragraph).

1. When reading the novel, press **(?)** to see the page number.
2. Remove the *Lord Jim* book card from your BOOKMAN, if you like.
3. Remember the page number, or write it in the space on the back of the *Lord Jim* book card.
4. When the *Lord Jim* book card is installed in your BOOKMAN, press **(CLEAR)**.
5. Highlight *Page Number* on the Setup menu.



6. Press **(ENTER)** twice.



7. Type the page number and then press **(ENTER)** to go to it.

Looking up Words in Other Books

You can look up words appearing in this novel in certain other BOOKMAN books. For example, you could look up a word from *Lord Jim* in a BOOKMAN dictionary.

To look up a word in another book – built into your BOOKMAN or a book card – that book must be able to receive words. To learn if a book can receive words, read its User's Guide.

1. Highlight a word in this novel.

To highlight a word in the novel, press **(ENTER)** and then press the arrow keys.

2. Hold **(*)** and press **(CARD)**.
3. Highlight the symbol of the other book.
4. Press **(ENTER)**.

The word that you highlighted appears in the other book.

5. Press **(ENTER)** to look up the word.

Resetting BOOKMAN

If the BOOKMAN keyboard fails to respond, or if its screen performs erratically, first press **(CLEAR)** and then press **(ON/OFF)** twice. If nothing happens, follow the steps below.

Warning: Pressing the reset button with more than very light pressure may permanently disable your BOOKMAN. In addition, resetting BOOKMAN erases settings and information entered into its built-in book and in any installed book cards.

1. Hold **(CLEAR) and press **(ON/OFF)**.**

If nothing happens, try Step 2.

2. Use a paper clip to gently press reset button on BOOKMAN.

This unit may change operating modes due to Electro-static Discharge. Normal operation of this unit can be re-established by pressing the reset key, **(ON/OFF)**, or by removing/replacing batteries.

► Troubleshooting Tips

Check that your book cards are installed correctly. Also check that the metal contacts on the book cards are dirt-and dust-free.

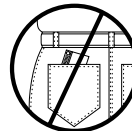
Book Card Care

Caution: Touching these electrical contacts with statically charged objects, including your fingers, could erase information entered in a book card or built-in book.



- **Do not put excessive weight on your book cards.**



- **Do not expose your book cards to heat, cold, or liquids.**
