- (BAT/PIT) (blue) Switches between batting and pitching statistics.
- Exits the selected book. CARD
- Turns BOOKMAN on or off. ON/OFF

Understanding the Color Keys

The color keys (red, green, yellow, and blue) perform the functions listed above only for the BOOKMAN book described in this User's Guide.

Other books have their own color key functions, which are labelled on their cartridges and listed in their User's Guides. For more information, read "Using the Color Keys."

Other Keys

- Backs up or erases letters. BACK
- ENTER Enters a request or selects a list item.
 - Shows help messages. HELP
- (SPACE) Types a space or pages down in help messages.
- (\cdot, \cdot) Types a decimal point.

Direction Keys

Moves in indicated direction.

Zooms to the beginning or end of an entry or list.

Star Key Combinations*

- (☆) + ♥♥ Displays the next or previous year's statistics.
- ि + **र** Types a dash.
- ☆ + **(**⊃ Types a slash.
- Shifts the top row of 🛱 + N letters to type numbers.

Warning: Never install or remove a cartridge when your BOOKMAN is turned on. If you do, information that you entered in its built-in book and in an installed cartridge will be erased.

- 1. Turn BOOKMAN off.
- 2. Turn BOOKMAN over.
- 3. Align the cartridge tabs with the notches in the slot.



4. Press the cartridge until it snaps into place.

Removing Cartridges

Warning: When you remove a cartridge to install another cartridge, information that you entered in the first cartridge will be erased.

Once you have installed a cartridge in your BOOKMAN, you must select which book you want to use.

- 1. Turn BOOKMAN on.
- 2. Press CARD.



These are sample books.

3. Press (⊐ or ⊏) to highlight the book you want.



4. Press ENTER to select it.

► Auto Shutoff & Auto Resume

If you forget to turn off your BOOKMAN, it will automatically shut off in two minutes.

Also, you can turn off BOOKMAN at any screen. When you turn BOOK-MAN on again, the screen that you last viewed will appear.

Using the Color Keys

The red, green, yellow, and blue keys on your BOOKMAN change functions according to which book is selected.

When the built-in book is selected, the color keys function as labelled on the BOOKMAN keyboard. When a book in a cartridge is selected, the color keys function as labelled on its cartridge.



Before you start using this book, you may want to view a demonstration of what it can do.

Once you have installed the cartridge and selected this book, type DEMO and press **ENTER** to view the demonstration. If you want to stop the demonstration, press **CLEAR**.



► Help is Always at Hand

You can view a help message at any screen by pressing (HELP). Use the direction keys or press (BACK) to read the help text. Then press (BACK) to exit help.

To read a tutorial about this book, press (HEP) at the REQUEST screen.

> Changing the Contrast

You can change the screen contrast by pressing \bigcirc and then repeatedly pressing \bigcirc or \bigcirc .

You can find a player's pitching and batting statistics by entering the player's name. If a player is primarily a pitcher then his pitching statistics will be displayed first, or if a player is primarily a batter, then his batting statistics will be displayed first.

1. Press CLEAR).

2. Type a player's name.



To erase letters, press (BACK) or ⟨⊐.

3. Press (ENTER) to view his full name and career totals.

To find a pitcher's batting statistics, press (BAT/PIT).

All Hall of Fame players have HOF to the right of their biographical information.

5. Use the arrow keys to view his statistics.

6. To zoom directly to the bottom of the page, hold (CAP) and then press (J.

You may zoom in any direction by holding CAP and then pressing the appropriate arrow key.

7. Press (CLEAR) when done.

➤ Just Follow the Arrows

The flashing arrows on the right of the screen show which arrow keys you can press to move through menus or view more text.

More About Entering Names

You can enter players by their first and last name, last and first name, last name alone, or even by first or nickname alone (e.g. MEL OTT, OTT MEL, OTT, or MEL). NOTE: By entering only a player's first or last name, the encyclopedia will find all of the players who share that name.

Correcting Players Names

If you misspell a player's name, or type a name that is ambiguous or unclear, don't worry. This encyclopedia will give you a list of matches and corrections to the name you entered.

For example, type RIPKEN and press ENTER. All of the players who have shared the name Ripken will be listed. Use the arrow keys to move the pointer to the desired player, and press (ENTER) to select that player. Every player in this encyclopedia is listed alphabetically by the year they began playing major league baseball. Here is how to find all of the rookies for a given year.

1. Type the desired year (e.g., 1994).

2. Press ENTER.

- 3. Use the arrow keys to view player's statistics.
- 4. Hold ☆ and press ♥ to view the next rookie listed alphabetically. Or, hold ☆ and press ŵ to view the previous one.

5. Press CLEAR when done.

> More About Finding Rookies

In addition, while viewing *any* player's statistics you can view statistics of other players who were rookies the same year, by holding and pressing *in* or *P*. For example, you can look up a player (e.g., Nolan Ryan) and discover which players began their career during the same year. To find a team's annual batting and pitching statistics, enter a team and a year. A team can be a team's name (e.g., *CUBS*), city (e.g., *CHICAGO*), or city abbreviation (e.g., *CHID*. If you don't enter a year, you'll view the team's statistics for the first year of a team's operation.

1. At the Request screen, type a team name and a year.

TYPE YOUR REQUEST FHILLIES 1980THEN PRESS ENTER

To type the year, press ☆ plus the numbered keys.

2. Press ENTER.



To view more team batting totals, press \Rightarrow .

3. Press I to view individual batting statistics.

4. Press (BAT/PIT) to view team pitching statistics.



- 6. To view the following year's statistics hold ☆ and press ♥. To view the previous year's statistics hold ☆ and press ŵ.
- 7. Press (CLEAR) when done.

Player Statistics from Team List

When viewing team statistics, you can view players' career and annual statistics simply by pressing (ENTER) when the pointer is next to their name.

You also can find team statistics from individual player statistics by pressing (ENTER) when the desired year is marked.

Correcting Team Names

If you enter a city or team name that is ambiguous or unclear, this encyclopedia will give you a list of teams from which to choose.

1. Type BRAVES and press (ENTER).

▶ TEAM CHOICES 1953-95 MIL BRAVES (NL) 1878-1952 BOS BRAVES (NL) 1968-95 ATL BRAVES (NL)

A list of team choices appears.

2. Use the arrow keys to mark 1966-95 ATL BRAVES.

3. Press ENTER to view team statistics.



4. Press (CLEAR) when done.

Misspelling Team Names

If you misspell a team or city name (e.g., YANKIES), you will view a list of players whose names are close to what you entered (e.g., HUGH YANCY, GEORGE YANKOWSKI, & YANK TERRY).

Finding League Standings

League standings include number of wins, number of losses, won/loss percentage (PCT), and games behind first place (GB).

Eastern Division records are shown first, the Central Division second, and the Western Division last, when applicable.

1. Type NL or AL and a year.

TYPE YOUR REQUEST (AL 93.______ ... THEN PRESS ENTER:

Type a space between the league and a year. To type the year hold the key and press the number keys.

- 2. Press ENTER.
- 3. Press J. repeatedly to view the standings.



4. Press (ENTER) to view a marked team's statistics for that year.

- 5. To view a previous year hold and press 🔊 . To view the following year's standings hold 🖾 and press 🏆.
- 6. Press (CLEAR) when done.

More About Standings

You can find teams' won/loss records and winning percentages over several seasons by entering their league and a year range. For example, enter NL 1990-1995.

Finding World Series and Award Winners

You can find awards and achievements with this encyclopedia. NOTE: You will not be able to find a listing for the 1994 World Series due to the 1994 baseball strike.

1. Type one of the following requests (e.g., AW 1974):

To View...

Type...

World Series Results All Award Winners Hall of Fame Players

WS + year AW + year HOF

2. Press (ENTER).

HAWARDS FOR 1974: AL CY: CATFISH HUNTER N. CY: MIKE MARSHALL N. CY: MIKE MARSHALL BURROUGHS

NOTE: The next two steps do not apply to Word Series results.

- 3. Press J. to move down the list.
- 4. Press (ENTER) to view a marked player's statistics.

NOTE: The next step does not apply to the Hall of Fame player list.

- 5. To view the next or previous year hold 🖾 and press 🖤 or 🎪.
- 6. Press (CLEAR) when done.

You can find a list of the up to 50 best or worst players for a specific statistic by using the MAX and MIN keys followed by a stat abbreviation.

NOTE: A list of all of the stat abbreviations that can be used in a request can be found in "Appendix B Abbreviations".

1. Press (MAX) and then type a stat abbreviation.

TYPE YOUR REQUEST

The space after MAX is typed automatically.

Instead of pressing the *max* button, you may type it.

2. Press ENTER.



- 3. Press 1, to view the players in the list.
- 4. Hold CAP and press \mathcal{J} to go to the bottom of the list.

- 5. Use the arrow keys to move the pointer to the desired player.
- 6. Press (ENTER) to view his career statistics.
- 7. Press CLEAR when done.

Biographical Information

You can request player lists using biographical stat abbreviations: HT for Height, WT for Weight, and AGE for Age. For example, enter MAX WT to view baseball's heavyweights. A ratio is one stat abbreviation divided by another. You can type a ratio rather than a single stat abbreviation after MAX or MIN in your requests. However,

- you can't divide a batting stat abbreviation by a pitching stat abbreviation or vice versa (e.g. AB/IP), and
- you can't use stat abbreviations in ratios that are already ratios (i.e., BA, ERA, SLG).
- 1. Press (MAX) and then type a ratio.

TYPE YOUR REQUEST... Max Hr/ab ...Then press enter

To type a I, hold \bowtie and press \triangleleft .

2. Press ENTER.



3. Use the arrow keys to view the players and their ratios.

- 4. To view a player's career statistics, press (ENTER) when his name is marked.
- 5. Press CLEAR when done.

► About Infinite Ratios

The value of a ratio is infinite when its denominator is zero. For example, if you enter MAX W/L, then press at to view the statistics, you'll see this:

INF (infinite) means that Ben Shields and others never lost a game.

Using Ratios Realistically

When you type requests with ratios, you'll often want to limit the denominator to view players with significant at-bats, innings pitched, and so on. Read "Adding a Limiter" to learn how. To limit the statistical range of your requests, type a limiter following MAX or MIN and the stat abbreviation or ratio. A limiter searches for statistics that are greater than or less than a particular number. Requests with limiters always have this structure:

MAX or MIN + a stat abbreviation or ratio + a stat abbreviation + GT or LT + a number

In this example, we'll find the players with the most home runs (MAX HR) who had less than 150 at bats (AB LT 150).

1. Press (MAX) or (MR), type a stat abbreviation or ratio, and then type a limiter.



You can either type GT or LT or press (()). To get GT press the button once; to get LT press the button twice.

- 2. Press ENTER.
- 3. Use the arrow keys to view the list.

Understanding Limiters

Each limiter must be proceeded by its own stat abbreviation, even when that stat abbreviation or ratio is the same as the one following MAX or MIN. For example, to view the players with the most home runs who have at least 500 home runs, you would need to enter MAX HR HR GT 499. Notice the second HR.

When you're limiting a ratio, you'll usually want to limit the denominator. For example, to view the players with the best home-run-to-at-bats ratio who have at least 1000 career at-bats, you would enter MAX HR/AB AB GT 1000.

Limiting Biographical Statistics

Type weight in pounds, height in inches (e.g., 67 for players who are 5'7"), and age in years.

In a given season, each player's age is determined by how old that player is on July 1. So a player who is 24 years old on June 30, is considered 24 years old for the entire season. You can also limit a request with one or more qualifiers. Qualifiers limit an entry to a specific quality (e.g., a team or a year.)

Team Qualifiers

To narrow your lists to a single team, add a team qualifier to your requests.

You can type only one team qualifier in a request. If you enter a team that has had more than one home city, or if you enter a city which has more than one team, you'll see a list of team choices first.

1. Press (MAX) or (MAX), type a stat abbreviation or ratio, and then type a team qualifier.



2. Press ENTER.



- 3. Use the arrow keys to view more statistics.
- 4. Press (CLEAR) when done.

Year Qualifiers

You can use year qualifiers to limit your request to a specific time frame. Here are some examples.

Qualifiers	Examples
a single year	1969
a starting year	1945–
an ending year	-1900
a year range	1980–89

1. Press (MAX) or (MN), type a stat abbreviation or ratio, and type a year qualifier.

TYPE YOUR REQUEST MAX HR/AB 70-85

To type a dash hold and press \mathfrak{P} .

- 2. Press ENTER.
- 3. Use the arrow keys to view more statistics.

Other Qualifiers

You can also narrow your lists by adding some of these qualifiers to your requests.

Qualifier Meaning

AL, NL	American or National League
BR, BL, BS	bats right, left, or switch
HOF, NHOF	Hall of Famers or not
QUAL	qualifier for league leader title
Р	pitchers
SS	any single season
TR, TL	throws right or left

1. Press (MAX) or (MN), type a stat abbreviation or ratio, and then type other qualifiers.



2. Press ENTER.



- 3. Use the arrow keys to view more statistics.
- 4. Press (CLEAR) when done.

Putting It All Together

To find highly specific lists, add a limiter *and* some qualifiers to your requests. You can add a limiter, a team qualifier, and as many other qualifiers as make sense, up to 48 characters. Your qualifiers can be in any order.

Advanced requests often will produce a list of fewer than 50 players. In this example, we'll find pitchers with the lowest earned run averages (MIN ERA), who pitched more than 500 innings (IP GT 500), played for the Cubs (CUBS), played from 1980 through 1989 (80-89), and threw right-handed (TR).

1. Type the following request: MIN ERA IP GT 500 CUBS 80-89 TR.

- 2. Press ENTER.
 - PLAYER
 SMITH, LEE
 ECKERSLEY, DENNIS

- 3. Use arrow keys to view players and statistics.
- 4. Press ENTER to view a player's career statistics.
- 5. Press CLEAR when done.

► Bad Requests

If you see the "Bad Request" message, check the following:

- that you typed correct stat abbreviations
- that your ratio doesn't mix batting and pitching stat abbreviations or contain another ratio (e.g., ERA, SLG, etc.).
- that your request contains no more than one limiter.

Sample Advanced Requests

- MIN BA HR GT 30 SS
- MAX SO ERA GT 4.5
- MAX W/L IP GT 2000 NL
- MAX HR WT LT 151 SS

If the BOOKMAN keyboard fails to respond, or if its screen performs erratically, first press (CLEAR) and then press (ANJOR) twice. If nothing happens, follow the steps below to reset it.

Warning: Pressing the reset button with more than very light pressure may permanently disable your BOOKMAN. In addition, resetting BOOKMAN erases settings and information entered into its built-in book, and in an installed cartridge.

- **1. Hold** (CLEAR) and press (N/OFF). If nothing happens, try Step 2.
- 2. Use a paper clip to gently press BOOKMAN's reset button.

Troubleshooting BOOKMAN

- Make sure your cartridge, if any, is installed correctly.
- Check that the cartridge's metal contacts are dirt-and dust-free.
