Key Guide

Function Keys

CLEAR

Clears to the entry screen. Shows the main menus.

) **(red)** Shows reference information about a particular topic and the topic's outline location.

(green) No function.

- (yellow) No function.

- CARD Exits the selected book.
- ON/OFF) Turns BOOKMAN on or off.

Understanding the Color Keys

The color keys (red, green, yellow, and blue) perform the functions listed above only for the book described in this User's Guide.

Other BOOKMAN books have their own color key functions, which are labelled on their cartridges or on the keyboard. For more information, read "Using the Color Keys."

Other Keys

- Backs up a step or erases a letter.
- CAP No function.
- ENTER

) Enters a search, selects a menu item, or goes directly to cross-referenced text.



-) Shows help messages.
-) Shows a full menu item; in text, shows the topic's outline location.

Direction Keys



- Move in indicated direction.
- 🔬 Pa
 - Page up or down.
- SPACE Pages down.

Star Key Combinations*

- + **Q...** Shifts top row of letters to type numbers.
- ☆ + Shows next title or paragraph.
- ☆ + ▲ Shows the previous title or paragraph.

*Hold while pressing the other key.

Warning: Never install or remove a cartridge when BOOKMAN is on. If you do, information that you entered in its built-in book and in an installed cartridge will be erased.

- 1. Turn BOOKMAN off.
- 2. Turn BOOKMAN over.
- 3. Align the tabs on the cartridge with the notches in the slot.



4. Press the cartridge until it snaps into place.

Removing Cartridges

Warning: When you remove a cartridge to install another, information that you entered in the removed cartridge will be erased.

Once you have installed a cartridge in your BOOKMAN, you must select which book you want to use.

- 1. Turn BOOKMAN on.
- 2. Press CARD.



These are sample books.

 [↓] to highlight the book you want to use.



4. Press (ENTER) to select it.

► Resuming Where You Left Off

You can turn off BOOKMAN at any screen. When you turn BOOKMAN on again, the screen that you last viewed appears. The red, green, yellow, and blue keys on your BOOKMAN change functions according to which book is selected.

When the built-in book is selected, the color keys function as labelled on the BOOKMAN keyboard. When a cartridge book is selected, the color keys function as labelled on that cartridge.



Remember, the color keys for BOOK-MAN books in cartridges function as labelled on their cartridges, not as on the keyboard.

Viewing a Demonstration

When no book cartridge is installed in your BOOKMAN, a demonstration automatically appears after you select this book. To stop the demo, press CLEAR. To disable it, press MENU and then select *Disable Demo*. To re-enable it, select *Enable Demo*.

When a book cartridge is installed, select *View Demo* from the Other menu to view its demo.

► Help is Always at Hand

You can view a help message at virtually any screen by pressing (HEP). Press the direction keys to read it. To exit help, press (BACK).

► Follow the Arrows

The flashing arrows on the right of the screen show which arrow keys you can press to move around menus or to view more text. You can adjust the type size, shutoff time, and screen contrast. The type size changes the number of lines of text that appear on screen. The shutoff time is how long BOOKMAN stays on if you forget to turn it off.

- 1. Press CLEAR).
- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Press the arrow keys to highlight the Other menu.
- 4. Highlight Set Type Size, Set Shutoff, or Set Contrast.



- 5. Press ENTER).
- 6. Highlight a setting.

Or press for the if you selected Set Contrast. To exit without changing settings, press (BACK).

7. Press (ENTER) to select it.

Throughout this product you will find decision trees asking you various questions about your child's emergency. This will narrow down the emergency so you can quickly find the doctor's advice you need.

At the end of a question you will see **NES NO**. Press **(Y)** to answer yes, or press **(N)** to answer no. There will often be more than one question to answer.

Your child has hit her head. Is she unconscious? **Misi IXO**

Does your child's neck hurt?

Can you answer yes to **any** of the following questions? • Was your child knocked To find information about your child's problem, type the symptom, illness, or emergency at the entry screen. You can find anything from a *Bee sting* to a *Broken bone*.

- 1. Press CLEAR).
- 2. Start typing nosebleed.



You go directly to the index list.

- 3. Press (INTER) when nosebleed is highlighted.
- 4. Press **.** to read the advice. There is a question at the end of the advice.
- 5. Press (Y) to answer yes or press (N) to answer no.
- 6. Continue answering all questions.
- 7. Press \clubsuit to read the advice.
- 8. Press (CLEAR) when done.

The Contents menu is divided into three categories. *Emergencies, Common Problems and Concerns,* and *Prevention.* They include general information about many children's health concerns. Read them to learn more about caring for your child's health.

- 1. Press (MENU).
- 2. Select a category from the Contents menu (e.g., *I Emergencies*).
- 3. Select a topic (e.g., 4. Choking).



4. Select a sub-topic, if needed (e.g., *Doctor's advice*).

Doctor's Advice 2023 General Information Choking is the most common

- 5. Press 🗘 to read.
- 6. Press (BACK) to go back to the previous screen.

► Typing Numbers

You can also find a category by typing the number in front of it. To type a number, hold (a) and press a numbered key.

Using the Index Menu

You can also go to the Index by pressing going to the main menus and then highlighting *Index*. Start typing an emergency to zoom directly to it. Press **ENEE** to go to the questions and then the advice. Press **(NEC)** (red) to read the topic's general reference information.

Prevention

This category is divided into three main topics with many sub-topics on preventing accidents, illnesses, and injuries.

- 43. Prevention of accidents Here you will find tips on everything from *The risks as your child grows* to *Toy safety.*
- 44. Immunizations (shots) Select this topic to find out about specific vaccines, if vaccines are safe, if your child should receive a dpt, and when your child should be immunized.

45. Physical fitness

Select this topic to learn how much exercise your child needs and when and how to start. There's also a word about smoking. Use the (me) (red) key to quickly find reference information about a topic, where you are in the outline, and to see a full name when only part is visible.

To find reference information

Another way to find reference information is to type the topic you want to learn more about (e.g., *fainting*) and then press (INTER). Next press (INTER) (red) and then press (I) to read about fainting.

► To find a topic's location

While you are in text, press (red) again. Or press (?*).



You are reading general information about fainting found in the Emergencies category.

➤ To view a full name

Some names and menu items are too long to fit onto one line. To view the full name, press r when the item is highlighted.



Reading Cross-References

When you see an **WREF**, press ENTER to go to the cross-referenced text. Press (BACK) to go back to the screen you were previously viewing.

Doctor's Advice 2003 General Information Choking is the most common

 Do not touch the metal contacts on the cartridges.

Resetting BOOKMAN

If the BOOKMAN keyboard fails to respond, or if its screen performs erratically, first press CLEAR and then press (N/OF) twice. If nothing happens, follow the steps below to reset it.

Warning: Pressing the reset button with more than very light pressure may permanently disable your BOOKMAN. In addition, resetting BOOKMAN erases settings and information entered into its built-in book, and in an installed cartridge.

- **1. Hold CLEAR) and press ON/OF**. If nothing happens, try Step 2.
- 2. Use a paperclip to *gently* press BOOKMAN's reset button.

The reset button is recessed in a pinsized hole on the back of BOOK-MAN. Look for it on the battery cover or near the cartridge slot.

Troubleshooting

- Make sure your cartridge is installed correctly.
- Check that the cartridge's metal contacts are dirt-and dust-free.

Optional Features



AC adaptor jack: Some BOOK-MAN models are equipped with a standard 3.5 mm jack for use with a 9-volt, 200-300 milliamp AC/DC adaptor.



This symbol indicates that the inner core of the plug of an AC adaptor is negative and that the outer part of the plug is positive. If your AC/DC adaptor does not have this symbol, confirm its compatibility at its place of purchase.

Headphone jack: Some BOOK-MAN models also have a 3.5 mm stereo headphone jack for use with a standard impedance 8 Ohm headset.
