HELP Displays help messages.

MENU Displays the main menus.

ON/OFF Turns BOOKMAN on or off.



Using the Special Features



Your BOOKMAN 770 is equipped with several special features that many, but not all, BOOKMAN books use. To learn if you can use the special features with a particular BOOKMAN book, read its User's Guide.

Headphone Jack: The headphone jack is designed for 3.5 mm, 35 ohm impedance stereo headphones. **Caution:** Monophonic headphones will not work with this BOOKMAN model.

Volume Control: The dial located under the headphone jack controls the volume of the speaker or headphones.

Serial Port: The serial port allows certain BOOKMAN books, when Franklin's 3.5 mm serial cable is connected to your BOOKMAN, to transfer data to a personal computer (PC). Warning: Using a serial cable other than the one obtained from Franklin

than the one obtained from Franklin may damage your BOOKMAN and/or PC. Franklin's serial cable is specifically designed for the transfer of data between BOOKMAN and a PC.

Speaker: The speaker is located on the back of your BOOKMAN near the serial port. For best results, do not cover the speaker with your hand.

Installing Batteries

Your BOOKMAN 770 is powered by two AAA, 1.5-volt batteries. Here is how to install or replace them.

Warning: When the batteries lose power or are removed from your BOOKMAN, information that you entered in its built-in book and in an installed book card will be erased.

- 1. Turn your BOOKMAN over.
- Remove the battery cover, located above the speaker, by compressing its tab with your finger and then lifting the cover.
- Install the batteries as shown in the diagram in the battery compartment.
- 4. Replace the battery cover.

> Resuming Where You Left Off

You can turn off your BOOKMAN at any screen. When you turn your BOOKMAN on again, the last screen that you viewed appears.

Installing Book Cards

Warning: Never install or remove a book card when your BOOKMAN is turned on. If you do, information that you entered in its built-in book and in an installed book card will be erased.

- 1. Turn your BOOKMAN off.
- 2. Turn your BOOKMAN over.
- 3. Align the book card tabs with the notches in a card slot.



Press the book card until it snaps into place.

> Removing Book Cards

Warning: When you remove a book card that doesn't have a built-in battery of its own, information that you entered in that book card will be erased.

Selecting a Book

Once you have installed a book card in your BOOKMAN, you can select which book to use.

- 1. Turn your BOOKMAN on.
- 2. Press CARD.



These are sample books.

3. Press ⇔ or ⇒ to highlight the book you want to use.



4. Press (ENTER) to select it.


> About the Screen Illustrations

Some screen illustrations in this User's Guide may differ slightly from what you see on screen. This does not mean that your BOOK-MAN is malfunctioning.

Using the Color Keys

The red, green, yellow, and blue keys on your BOOKMAN change their functions according to which book you're using.

When the built-in book you're using, the color keys function as labelled on the BOOKMAN keyboard. When you're using a book card, the color keys function as labelled on that card.



Remember, the color keys for book cards function as labelled on their cards, not as labelled on the BOOKMAN keyboard

Changing the Settings

You can adjust the type size, shutoff time, and screen contrast of your BOOKMAN, as well as turn off or on the pronunciation guide in this Bible, by using the Setup menu.

The shutoff time is how long your BOOKMAN stays on if you forget to turn it off. The pronunciation guide shows how to pronounce words when you press (SAY).

- 1. Press MENU .
- Use the arrow keys to highlight Pron Guide Off/On, Set Type Size, Set Shutoff, or Set Contrast on the Setup menu.



- 3. Press ENTER.

 If you select *Pron Guide Off/On*,
 don't go to Step 4. To leave the settings unchanged, press (BACK).
- 4. Use 介 and ↓ to highlight a new setting and press ENTER.

Viewing a Demonstration

Before you start using your BOOKMAN, you may want to see a brief demonstration of what it can do.

When a book card is installed in your BOOKMAN, select *View Demo* from the Setup menu to see the demonstration.

When a book card is not installed in your BOOKMAN, the demonstration will automatically appear after you turn on the BOOKMAN. To stop the demonstration, press (CLEAR). To disable it, press (MENU) and then select Disable Demo from the Setup menu. To re-enable it, select Enable Demo.

> Help is Always at Hand

At virtually any screen display, you can view a help message by pressing HELP. Press J. or SPACE to read it. To exit help, press BACK. Note: To read a tutorial about this book, select *Tutorial* from the Setup menu.

> Follow the Arrows

The flashing arrows at the right of the screen show which arrow keys you can press to move through menus or view more text.

Reading the Bible

The simplest way to use this Bible is to select a book from the Old or New Testament and then read its text

- 1. Press (CLEAR).
- 2. Press (MENU).
- Use the arrow keys to highlight a book on the Old or New menu. For example, highlight Romans under New.



4. Press (ENIER) to go to the first verse of that book.




Looking up a Bible Verse

Looking up a Bible Verse

To go directly to a specific Bible verse, simply enter its book title, chapter number, and verse number. If you enter only a book title and chapter number, you go to the start of the chapter. If you enter only a book title, you go to the start of that book.

- 1. Press (CIFAR).
- 2. Type a book title, chapter number, and verse number.



You can type only capital letters. To type a number, hold 🖈 and press a numbered key. Type a colon or a space between the chapter and verse numbers. To type a colon, press To type an apostrophe, hold CAP and press ... To erase a character, press (BACK).

3. Press (ENTER).

- 4. Use ♣, ⋈, or SPACE to read it.
- 5. When you're done, press (CLEAR) to clear your request.

➤ Verse Finding Tips

Here are some notes that will help you to look up verses:

- Type abbreviations rather than complete book titles (e.g., ps for Psalms or eph for Ephesians).
- Type an Arabic or Roman numeral before books of more than one volume (e.g., 1 Samuel or Il Kings). To type a number, hold and press a numbered kev.
- Some book titles, such as Numbers and John, are also valid search words. When you search for one of these ambiguous words, a menu appears that asks you to select which type of request you want.

Whenever you see a superscript P (P) after a people or place name, you can hear and see its pronunciation. Try this example.

- 5. To hear the word again, press (green) again.
- 6. To turn off the pronunciation guide, press another key.

Note: The pronunciation guide disappear automatically after 20 seconds.

- 7. Highlight other words marked with superscript P's and then press (sw) to hear them.
- 8. Press BACK to turn off the highlight.

➤ Disabling the Pronunciation Guide

If you don't want to see the pronunciation guide whenever you press (Green), highlight *Pron Guide Off* on the Setup menu and then press (ENIER) to select it. To turn the pronunciation guide on again, select *Pron Guide On*.

Searching for Words

You can search for almost any word or words in this Bible, just as if you were using a concordance. Simply enter search words to find their occurrences, or matches.

- 1. Press CLEAR).
- Type up to five words. For example, type Lord Shepherd.



> If You Misspell a Word

If you enter a misspelled word, or a word not found in this Bible, a list of spelling corrections appears. Highlight a correction and then press

(ENTER) to select it, or press (BACK) to change your request.

➤ Words You Can't Search For

The following words are too common to search for, either by entering them or by highlighting them in verses: a, an, and, are, as, be, but, by, for, from, he, her, him, his, I, in, is, it, me, my, not, O, of, our, out, shall, she, that, the, their, them, they, to, up, upon, us, was, we, were, with, you.


Searching for Phrases

You can search for phrases—adjacent or nearly adjacent words in a particular order—by selecting an ordered search and a narrow search width.

An ordered search finds words only in the order that you enter them. For example, an ordered search for *Holy Spirit* will not find *spirit* holy.

The search width determines how far apart your search words can be in the Bible and still be a match.

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Highlight *Ordered Search* on the Search menu.



- 3. Press ENTER to select it.
- 4. Press (MENU).
- 5. Highlight Set Search Width on the Search menu.

A check marks your previous selection.

6. Press ENTER to select it.

Searching for Phrases



- 7. Press ENIER to select Close Together.
- 8. Type a phrase and then press (ENIER) to search for it. For example, enter *Holy Spirit*.
- 9. Hold and press repeatedly to view the next matches. Or press MENU to see the books with matches.
- 10. Press (CLEAR) when done.

➤ Understanding Search Widths

This is how far apart your search words can be in verses when you a select a certain search width:

Search Width	Distance Apart
Close Together	nearly adjacent
Not as Close	a few words
Far Apart	many words
Very Far Apart	up to a few verses

Highlighting Search Words

You can also search for a word by highlighting it in a verse. Try this example.

1. Find *Romans 3:5*.



Expanding Your Searches

You can expand your word searches up to three times to find inflections, synonyms, and similar words.

- 1. Press (CLEAR).
- Type a word and press ENTER.For example, enter belief.

Expanding Your Searches

➤ Understanding Expansions

Each time that you expand a word search, similar words are added to your search.

The first time that you press (MORE), inflections are added (e.g., believe and believed to belief).

The second time that you press (MORE), compound and related words are added (e.g., believer and unbelief to belief).

The third time that you press (MORE), synonyms are added (e.g., understand and surely to belief).

When you expand a multiple-word search, words similar to any or all your search words are added.

Note: Sometimes pressing (MORE) only once does not expand a search because your search word(s) have no inflections in this Bible. In that case, press (MORE) a second and a third time to expand your search.

Reading Footnotes

Whenever you see a after a word, that word has a footnote. These footnotes provide alternative translations, describe textual variants, and define obscure words. Try this example.

Reading Footnotes

When More Than One Footnote Appears on Screen

Sometimes more than one appears on the screen at one time. In that case, pressing NOTE displays the footnote of the first .

To view the subsequent footnotes, press ENTER and then the arrow keys to highlight a subsequent D



Using Bookmarks

To quickly find your favorite verses, you can place up to 30 bookmarks in this Bible.

Adding a Bookmark

 When a Bible verse is on screen, press LIST (the blue key).



2. Highlight *Add...* and then press FNTER to add a bookmark (國) to that verse.

Viewing a Bookmark

- 1. When a Bible verse is on screen, press LIST (blue).
- 2. Press ENIER to select View Bookmark.
- 3. Highlight a verse and then press (ENTER) to view it.

➤ A Quick Way to Add Bookmarks

You can also add a bookmark to a verse by holding and pressing when that verse is on screen.

Using Bookmarks

Deleting a Bookmark

- 1. When a Bible verse is on screen, press LIST (blue).
- 2. Highlight the verse whose bookmark you want to delete.
- 3. Press ENTER.
- 4. Press (v) to delete the bookmark or (N) to keep it.

➤ Deleting All Your Bookmarks

Caution: When you delete all your bookmarks as described below, the settings revert to their original states: *Ordered Search* off, *Close Together* search width, *Medium* type size, and *2 Minutes* shutoff time. To learn how to change the settings, read "Changing the Settings."


To delete all your bookmarks at one time, first turn off your BOOKMAN. Then hold (ON/OFF) and press (CLEAR) to reset it.

Sending Words Between Books

This BOOKMAN can send words between certain books.

To send a word, you must first install a book card in your BOOKMAN, and that book card must be able to send or receive words. To learn if a book card can send or receive words, read its User's Guide.

1. Highlight a word in this book.



To highlight a word in text, press (ENIER) and then press the arrow keys. To highlight a word in a list, press the arrow keys.

- 2. Hold 🖈 and press CARD.
- 3. Highlight the other book.
- 4. Press ENTER.

The word that you highlighted appears in the other book.

5. Press ENTER to look up the word.

Resetting Your BOOKMAN

If the keyboard fails to respond, or if the screen performs erratically, first press (CLEAR) and then press (ON/OFF) twice. If nothing happens, follow the steps below to reset it.

Warning: Pressing the reset button with more than light pressure may permanently disable your BOOKMAN. Also, resetting BOOKMAN erases settings and information entered in its built-in book and in an installed book card.

- **1. Hold** CLEAR and press ON/OFF. If nothing happens, try Step 2.
- 2. Use a paper clip to *gently* press the reset button on BOOKMAN.

The reset button is recessed in a pin-sized hole on the back of BOOKMAN. Look for it on the battery cover or near the book card slot.

This unit may change operating modes due to Electro-static Discharge. Normal operation of this unit can be re-established by pressing the reset key, ON/OFP, or by removing/replacing batteries.
