Getting Started



Read this section first to learn how to set up the Bartender's Guide in the Digital Book System.

Installing the Digital Book

You must first install this digital book before you can use it. **WARNING:** Never install a digital book when the Digital Book System is on.

1. Turn the Digital Book System off.
2. Install the digital book into a slot on the back.
3. Press **ON/OFF**.
4. Turn the wheel on the side of the Digital Book System to adjust the contrast.

If the screen is still blank, check the batteries.

5. Press **CARD**.
6. Press **←** or **→** to highlight the appropriate digital book symbol.



7. Press **ENTER**.


✓ Protecting Your Digital Books

If you install or remove a digital book while the Digital Book System is on, information that you entered in other installed digital books may be permanently erased.

Using Menus

To begin most functions of this digital book, you must use the menus. This lesson shows you how to move around the main menus and select menu items.

1. Press **CLEAR**.



2. Press the arrow keys to highlight menus and menu items.

The flashing arrows at the bottom of the screen show which arrow keys you can press.

3. Press **ENTER** to select a highlighted item.

A check marks the selected menu item.

4. Press **BACK** to return to the main menus.

✓ Help is at Hand


Except during the demonstration, you can always view an appropriate help message by pressing **HELP**. To read the message, press  or . To exit it, press **BACK**.

Getting Started

Viewing a Demonstration

Before you start using this digital book, you might want to see a quick demonstration of what it can do.

1. Press **CLEAR**.
2. Highlight “Demo” under the Other menu.



3. Press **ENTER**.
4. Press **CLEAR** to stop the demo at any time.

Setting the Shutoff Time

The Digital Book System has the ability to shut itself off if no key has been pressed in a certain amount of time, determined by you. This ensures longer life for your batteries.

1. Press **CLEAR**.
2. Highlight “Set Shutoff” under the Other menu.
3. Press **ENTER**.
4. Highlight the time you want to select.
5. Press **ENTER** to select it.

Searching for a Drink



In this section you can learn how to search for a drink by its name, ingredients, or attributes.

Searching for a Drink


Searching by Name

Finding the recipe of a drink is easy. Simply type the name of the drink at the Cocktails menu. You don't need to type capital letters or spaces. *Goal:* to find a Sloe Gin Fizz.

1. Press **CLEAR**.
2. Highlight **"Cocktails"** under the Topics menu.
3. Press **ENTER**.


Notice the far left menu is "Cocktails". This shows what the selected topic is.

4. Type **"sloeginfizz"**.



To erase a letter, press **BACK**.

5. Press **ENTER**.



Here's the recipe. Use the arrow keys to scroll down line by line, or press **DN** or **SPACE** to page down screen by screen.

6. Press **CLEAR** to return to the Cocktails menu.

Searching by Ingredients

You can select more than one ingredient. Let's start our search with just one ingredient and then add on. *Goal:* all cocktails made with vodka and cranberry juice.

1. Select “Cocktails” under the Topics menu.
2. Press  to highlight the Locate menu.
3. Press  to select “Ingredients”.
4. Type “vod”.
5. Press  to select “Vodka”.




To deselect an ingredient, press  again.

6. Type “cran”.
7. Press  to select “Cranberry juice”.

Now there are nine matching recipes.

8. Press  to view the cocktail matches.
9. Type a cocktail or scroll down.
10. Press  to view a recipe.



Searching for a Drink

10. Press **BACK** to return to the matches.
11. Press **↵** to return to the **Locate** menu.
Notice the bullet beside the word “Ingredients.” This means you have at least one ingredient selected.
12. Press **CLEAR** to remove restrictions.

✓ Understanding Asterisks

After you select an ingredient, you might notice the ingredients above and below now have two asterisks (**) beside their names. These are the ingredients that do not occur in any drinks with the ingredient(s) which you have already selected.

✓ Viewing the Next or Previous Recipe

While in a recipe, hold **○** and press **▽DN** to view the next recipe alphabetically.

To view the previous recipe alphabetically hold **○** and press **△UP**.

Searching by Attributes

Some of you may have a favorite drink that you would like to try in a variety of recipes. Take the Bloody Mary for example. There are eighteen different recipes all derived from the original Bloody Mary mix. To find these and the following, read on.

- Bloody Mary Variations
- Flavored Vodkas
- Hot Drinks
- House Specialties
- Martini Variations
- Nonalcoholic Drinks
- Pousse-Cafés
- Punches
- Smirnoff Splashes
- Vodka Martini Variations

1. With “Cocktails” as the selected topic, highlight “Attributes” under the Locate menu.
2. Press **ENTER**.
3. Highlight the attribute you want to view.
4. Press **ENTER**.
5. Press **←** to view the list of matches.
6. Highlight a cocktail, then press **ENTER**.
7. Hold **○** and press **▽DN** to view the next recipe.
8. Press **BACK** to return to the matches.
9. Press **CLEAR** to return to Cocktails.

Searching for Other Topics



This section shows you how to find more than cocktails. It has many useful reference tips and helpful information. All of this section can be found under the Topics menu.

Using the Glossary

The glossary in your Bartender's Guide works as a printed glossary does. You can find definitions of drink names, brands of liquor, and bartending terms.

1. Highlight **“Glossary”** under the **Topics** menu.
2. Press **ENTER** to view the glossary.
3. Type a word you want to know more about (e.g., **Drambuie**).
4. Press **ENTER** when your word is highlighted.
5. Press **↓** to scroll down the definition.
6. Press **BACK** to return to the glossary.
7. Press **CLEAR** to find a new word.

✓ Zooming Through Menus

Remember, you can zoom to the top or bottom of a menu by holding **○** and pressing either **↑** or **↓**.

Learning About Liquors

This feature gives you many in-depth accounts of liquors (e.g., tequila, gin, etc.). Each selection includes the history of the liquor, how it's made, quotes about the liquor, and even suggestions for use.

1. Select “Liquors” under the Topics menu.
2. Type a liquor or scroll down.
3. Press **ENTER** to select a liquor.
4. Press **CLEAR** to return to the Liquors menu.

✓ Resuming Where You Left Off

When using the Digital Book System, you can turn the unit off at any time. When you turn it on again, the last screen you viewed will appear.

Learning How To

This section includes helpful information and advice for the aspiring bartender.

1. Select “How To” under the Topics menu.
2. Type a title or scroll down.
3. Press **ENTER** to select a title.
4. Press **↓** to scroll down or **DN** to page down.
5. Press **BACK** to return to the How To menu.

✓ Viewing Full Menu Items

Some items are too long to fit on a menu. When you see a menu item followed by ellipses, press **?*** to view the complete item.

Learning Secrets

The Bartender's Guide includes bartender's secrets—anything from “How to wash glasses” to “Presentation of rum drinks.” You'll find this feature helpful and interesting.

1. Select “Secrets” under the Topics menu.

2. Press  or type a number to select a secret.

To type a number hold  and press a numbered key.

3. Press  to select it.

4. Press  to scroll down.

5. Press  to return to the Secrets menu.

✓ Typing Numbers

Remember, you can also select a secret by its number. To type a number, hold  and press a numbered key.

Converting Measurements

This is a helpful feature when you need one measurement converted to another. Here are the measurements that you can convert:

- Barspoon
- Cup
- Dash
- Jigger
- Milliliter
- Ounce
- Pony
- Tablespoon
- Teaspoon
- Wine Glass

1. **Select “Measurements” under the Topics menu.**
2. **Type a measurement or scroll down.**
3. **Press .**
“9 items” means there are nine ways to convert this measurement using different measuring devices.
4. **Highlight a conversion.**
5. **Press to select it.**
6. **Press to return to the submenu.**
7. **Press again to return to the Measurements menu.**

Converting Bottle Measures

This feature gives you the precise measurements of six bottle sizes: the split, tenth, fifth, quart, magnum, and double magnum.

1. Select **“Bottle Measures”** under the Topics menu.
2. Type a measure or scroll down.
3. Press **(ENTER)**.
You will see the measurement converted to ounces, liters, and serving size.
4. Press **(CLEAR)** to return to the Bottle Measures menu.

Finding Old Bottle Sizes

You can find the sizes for the miniature, half pint, pint, fifth, quart, and half gallon.

1. Select **“Old Bottle Sizes”** under the Topics menu.
2. Type a size or scroll down.
3. Press **(ENTER)**.
You will see the old bottle size, the new bottle size, and serving size.
4. Press **(BACK)** to return to the Old Bottle Sizes menu.

Appendixes



This section reviews key features of the Digital Book System.

Resetting the Digital Book System

To reset the Digital Book System, hold **CLEAR** while pressing **ON/OFF**. Or press the recessed reset button on the back of the Digital Book System. (Read its Basic Operating Guide for details.)

Warning: Resetting the Digital Book System may permanently erase information, such as notes, that you have entered in the installed digital books.

Note: If the keyboard fails to respond or the screen performs erratically, you can press **CLEAR** and then press **ON/OFF** rather than resetting the Digital Book System. If nothing happens, then reset.

Protecting and Cleaning

- Do not touch the metal contacts on the back of digital books or the rubber contacts on the Digital Book System with statically charged objects. Statically charged objects may erase information that you entered in the digital books.
- Do not put excessive weight on digital books or the Digital Book System, or expose them to extreme or prolonged heat, cold, or other adverse conditions.
- To clean digital books, apply isopropyl alcohol with cotton swab. To clean the Digital Book System, apply a mild household cleaner with a soft cloth.

Caution: Spraying liquids on digital books or the Digital Book System may damage them.

Replacing the Batteries

The DBS-1 and DBS-2 use four 3-volt, CR2032 lithium batteries. The DBS-2D uses four 1.5-volt, AA batteries.

1. Have new batteries ready.
2. Turn the Digital Book System off.
3. Slide the battery cover off the back.
4. Remove all the batteries.
5. Place new batteries in the cavities, with the +’s oriented correctly. (In the DBS-1 and DBS-2, the +’s should face up.)
6. Replace the battery cover

✓ Battery Precautions

When you replace batteries, follow these precautions to avoid erasing information on your installed digital books:

- Replace the batteries before they lose power;
- Once batteries have been removed, install new ones within two minutes;
- Don’t mix old and new batteries;
- Never remove batteries with the unit on.
