

The Digital Book System®

What are Digital Books?

Digital books are matchbox-sized memory cards that can store up to 200 megabytes of information, the equivalent of 20 printed Bibles. Digital books provide searching, scanning, spell-checking, cross-referencing, and other features not found in printed books.

Most digital books store their information in read-only memory (ROM). Some digital books also have random-access memory (RAM) that allows you to enter and store your own information.

What Can the Digital Book System Do?

At home, work, or school, you can use the Digital Book System to

- find words, phrases, topics, and articles in digital books,
- · view text and graphics easily and quickly,
- · play exciting and educational games,
- switch between installed digital books, and
- · highlight and send words between digital books.

The real power of the Digital Book System is its ability to carry and use multiple digital books wherever you go. Many digital books interact. For example, you can find an article in an encyclopedia digital book and then look up the definition of a word in that article in a dictionary digital book.

How to Use This Guide


Before you use the Digital Book System, read this Basic Operating Guide. You can follow the numbered steps even if you use digital books other than those shown in the examples.

Installing Batteries

The Digital Book System (model DBS-2) is powered by four lithium batteries. Before following these steps below, have a complete set of fresh batteries ready.

Caution: Always replace the batteries in the Digital Book System before they completely lose power. A warning message appears when the battery power is low.

- 1. Turn the Digital Book System off.
- 2. Press down and slide the battery cover off the back.
- 3. Remove all the batteries.
- 4. Place a battery, with its plus sign facing you, at the bottom of each battery cavity.
- 5. Place a battery, plus sign up, at the top of each cavity.



The metal contact must touch the top battery.


6. Replace the battery cover.

Installing Digital Books

The Digital Book System works only when at least one digital book is installed in a book slot. If you install a single digital book, it does not matter which book slot you use.

Warning: Never install digital books while the Digital Book System is turned on. If you do, information that you entered in those digital books may be permanently erased.

- 1. Turn the Digital Book System off.
- 2. Insert a digital book into a slot on the back of the Digital Book System at a 45-degree angle.



The metal contacts on the digital book should face down.


- 3. Align the tabs on the digital book with the notches in the slot.
- 4. Snap the digital book into the slot.

Removing Digital Books

Here is how to remove and replace digital books from the Digital Book System.

Warning: Never remove digital books when the Digital Book System is turned on. If you do, information that you entered in those digital books may be permanently erased.

- 1. Turn the Digital Book System off.
- 2. Compress the tab on an installed digital book.




Do not pry the tab with a pen, pencil, or other sharp object.

3. Pull the digital book from its book slot.

Getting Started

Once digital books are installed, you are ready to start using your Digital Book System.

- 1. Press ON/OFF).
- 2. Adjust the screen contrast to your liking.



3. If the screen remains blank, check the batteries in the Digital Book System.

About Automatic Shutoff

The Digital Book System features automatic shutoff timing. If you forget to turn off the Digital Book System, it will shut off automatically after a few seconds or minutes. Some digital books let you adjust the shutoff timing. To learn how, read their User's Manuals.


Selecting Digital Books

Since you can install more than one digital book in the Digital Book System, you usually need to select which installed digital book you want to read.


You do this by pressing CARD and selecting a digital book symbol. You can select another installed digital book to view at any time.

The digital books in the example below are the Merriam-Webster® Advanced Dictionary and the Digital Book Demo.

1. Press CARD).



2. Press 🔁 or 🗗 to highlight a digital book symbol.




- 3. Press (ENTER) to select it.
- 4. To select the other digital book, repeat Steps 1-3.

Listening to Audio Digital Books

Some Digital Book System models include an earphone jack. By using earphones, you can listen to audio digital books that store and play speech, music, or sound effects. *Note:* Not all digital books are audio digital books.

- 1. Plug earphones into the earphone jack.
- 2. If needed, adjust the volume.



Communicating with the Serial Port

In the future, some digital books will be able to send and receive information through the serial port. The serial port allows the Digital Book System to connect to another device, such as a personal computer or modem, with a serial port of its own. To learn how to use the serial port, read the User's Manuals of the appropriate digital books, when available.


Using the Digital Book System Demo

Your Digital Book System may include a Digital Book System Demo. Besides presenting a multimedia demonstration of what the Digital Book System can do, this digital book lists digital book titles published by Franklin and includes the Letris word game.

Viewing a Demonstration

If your Digital Book System includes an earphone jack, plug in earphones and put them on before following these steps.

- 1. With the demo digital book installed, press CARD).
- 2. Highlight the DBS Demo symbol and then press (ENTER).
- 3. Highlight the Multimedia Demo symbol.



- 4. Press (ENTER) to start the demonstration.
- 5. Press (CLEAR) to stop the demonstration at any time.

Reading About Digital Books

- 1. Press (CLEAR).
- 2. Highlight the Digital Book Product Review symbol and then press (ENTER).
- 3. Press To highlight a digital book series.

- 4. Press (ENTER) to select a series.
- 5. Press To highlight a digital book title.
- 6. Press (ENTER) to view information about that title.

Press to scroll down. Or press plus for to view information about the next or previous title.

Playing Letris


In Letris, you direct falling letters to form words.

- 1. Press CLEAR).
- 2. Highlight the Letris symbol.
- 3. Press (ENTER).
- 4. As letters fall, press 🔁 or 🗗 to move them left or right.
- 5. Press 🕒 to zoom letters to the bottom.
- 6. Press (CLEAR) when done.

Help is Always at Hand

When viewing digital books, you can read appropriate help messages by pressing (HELP). To scroll or page down the message, press (BACK).

Function Keys

CLEAR	Clear the screen to the initial display.
MENU	View the main menus.
GAMES	View the games, if any.
MORE	View more information.
LIST	View a list of words, notes, etc.
SPEC	Do special tasks.
CARD	Exit the digital book.

Sending Words Between Books

You can increase the reference power of your Digital Book System by sending words between installed digital books. *Note:* Most digital books can send and receive only one or two words at a time, and some cannot receive any words.

In this example, we'll look up a word from the Concise Columbia Encyclopedia in the Merriam-Webster® Advanced Dictionary.

1. Highlight a word or phrase in an installed digital book.

To learn how to highlight words in a digital book, read its User's Manual. Usually, you press (ENTER) and then the arrow keys to highlight a word.

- 2. Hold and press CARD.
- 3. Highlight the other digital book symbol.
- 4. Press (ENTER) to select it.

Type in a word, then press (11111).

Press (11320) for other options.

5. Press (ENTER) again to search for the word.

^{*} Hold while pressing the other key.

Resetting the Digital Book System


Should the keyboard fail to respond or the screen perform erratically, you can reset the Digital Book System. *Note:* Before resetting, press CLEAR once and, if nothing happens, press ON/OFF twice. These steps may eliminate the need for resetting.

Warning: Resetting the Digital Book System resets the installed digital books to their default settings and may permanently erase information, such as notes, that you have entered in them.

1. Hold (CLEAR) and press (ON/OFF).

This is a soft reset.

2. Press the recessed reset button on the back of the Digital Book System using a paper clip.



Do not use a pen or a pencil. This is a hard reset.

3. Press (ON/OFF) to turn on the Digital Book System.

Product Care

To enjoy the maximum performance and longest use of your Digital Book System and digital books, follow these precautions.

 Do not touch the metal contacts on the back of digital books or the rubber contacts in the book slots of the Digital Book System.






Protecting Your Information


If the metal contacts of a digital book are touched by statically charged objects, including your fingers, information in that digital book could be permanently erased.

Also, touching the rubber contacts in the book slots of the Digital Book System could damage them.


Product Care

 Do not put excessive pressure on your digital books or Digital Book System.





 Do not expose your digital books to heat, cold, or liquids.





Troubleshooting

Problems	Solutions		
1. I don't see anything on the screen.	1a. Check that the batteries are installed correctly.

2. The screen contrast is too light or dark.	2. Turn the contrast control wheel on the side of the Digital Book System.		
3. I cannot hear a digital book.	3a. Be sure that the digital book is an audio digital book.		
	3b. Turn the volume control wheel on the side of the Digital Book System.		
4. My Digital Book System is performing erratically.	4a. Check that your digital books are installed correctly. In particular check that their metal contacts are dirt- and dust-free.		
	4b. Check or change the batteries.		
5. The keyboard or screen doesn't respond.	 5a. Press CLEAR . 5b. Press ON/OFF twice. If nothing happens, try Steps 5c and 5d. 5c. Press CLEAR + ON/OFF . 5d. Press the reset button on the back of the Digital Book System. 		

Glossary

Arrow keys • The keys with arrows on them that let you scroll through menus and text.

Book slots • The openings on the back of the Digital Book System into which the digital books are installed.

Card • Another name for a digital book.

Default settings • The settings for type size, shutoff time, etc., that apply to a digital book from the factory or after resetting the Digital Book System.

Digital book • Small, portable memory cards that store and retrieve information.

Digital Book System • A portable unit that lets you read information in digital books.

Direction keys • The arrow keys and all Gold-key combinations that let you move through menus and text.

Function keys • The eight keys at the top of the keyboard. Each function key performs a unique function.

Gold-key combinations • Combination keystrokes performed by holding while pressing another key.

Help message • Information that explains the current display and keystroke options.

On-card battery • A small battery built into certain digital books. It lets you remove a card from the Digital Book System without losing information that you have entered.

Page • Move screen by screen.

RAM • Random-access memory.

Memory to which information can
be added or deleted.

Reset • Returns the Digital Book System to its default settings. There is a soft reset and a hard reset.

ROM • Read-only-memory.

Memory that cannot be changed.

All digital books have ROM.

Screen • The liquid crystal display (LCD) on which information appears.

Scroll . Move line by line.

Serial port • The connection through which certain digital books can send and receive information from a computer, modem, etc.

Shutoff timing • The time in which the Digital Book System automatically shuts off when it is not being used.

To clean your digital books, apply isopropyl alcohol with a cotton swab. To clean the Digital Book System, apply a mild household cleaner on to a soft cloth and then wipe the unit.
